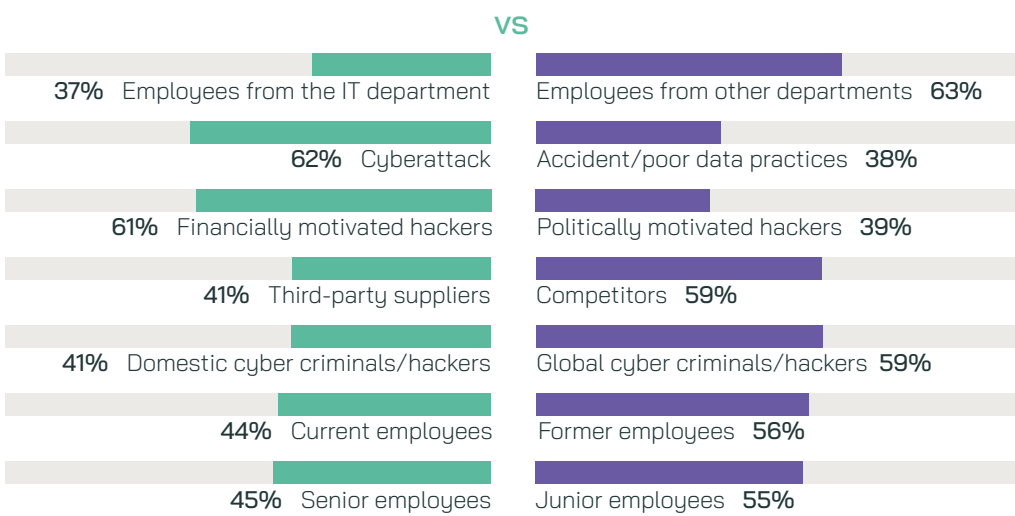
of enterprises say security is a key driver for spend in the IT department

What are the biggest threats?

Looking at the following pairs, these are the areas IT decision makers think are most threatening to IT security. Are IT departments focused on the right things? How can IT departments work to protect and mitigate their organisation from all of these?



Key takeaways

1. Security is a key driver for IT spend this year and remains a key priority in IT departments
2. IT decision makers think cyberattacks are more of a threat than accidents/poor data practices
3. There's just a 10% difference between junior and senior employees as a threat to security

Methodology

Vanson Bourne interviewed 300 IT decision makers in October and November 2019. Respondents were from organisations with 1,000 or more employees in private sectors. Interviews were conducted online.
